



Salvation Explained: Salvation is Conditional

In this book, we will explore the conditional part of Salvation. As with any agreement, there are conditions that you must meet to be completely salvaged. However, if you do not meet those conditions, salvation can be jeopardized. We explore the conditional nature of Salvation and why it is important to meet all of those conditions.




WARNING!!!

We will warn you that what we are presenting is going against the doctrinal teachings of many denominations. Many are going to excoriate this site because we are not following their doctrine. Many times, the people who are going to say we are teaching ' a false gospel' would be the ones that say that they have read the bible from cover to cover multiple times and will claim to be the 'authority' on the bible because they did that.

So, If you think we are full of it, that's fine. That is expected.

Many will call this a 'works based salvation' doctrine, which in effect it is NOT. **It is being obedient to The Lord Jesus Christ** as we are showing that we love Him **through our obedience to HIM**, doing what He is asking **US** to do. Nobody is forcing you to believe anything, Christian, so settle down.

It will be **YOUR** salvation on the line, so use this time you have to make your election **SURE** and work out YOUR salvation with fear and trembling by **confirming it with the Lord Jesus Christ directly YOURSELF, since Jesus is going to be judging you** when you die anyway.



The Salvation Promises from Jesus are Conditional

This book will show you how the promises of Jesus are ALL Conditional. A **conditional statement** is defined as the following:

Adjective

1. **depending on other factors; not certain**
2. (grammar) expressing a condition on which something else is contingent

Did you get that, Christian? The condition depends on other factors.

What we are going to do is use the proof texts for Once Saved, Always Saved, and you will see for yourself how the promises are conditional. First, though, you have to understand the structure of a conditional statement. Let's take a look at a very famous scripture and pull it apart:

2 Chronicles 7:14 - **If** my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; **then** will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Look at the highlighted words. Notice that the statements are conditional, which means the Lord of Hosts will do something that you want of need IF you will do something that the Lord of Hosts wants you to do.

For those who do programming, what is shown is a classic **IF... THEN** statement, which looks something like this:

IF
<event> (is TRUE)
THEN
Do these things
ENDIF

(Note: The ENDIF is there to let the compiler know that this is the end of the statement when it is translated into machine code for the computer to do the instructions. In some programming languages, the ENDIF is left off and substituted by a period.)

Not all of you can do programming or care to or do programming, but this is logical construct that is used ALL the time. Let's show it this way, so it is easier to understand:

IF Chloe cleans her stank, nasty, filthy room
THEN Chloe can go outside and play for 2 hours
(or) **ELSE** Chloe is grounded for a week
ENDIF

Let's take **2 Chronicles 7:14** and put it into our structure so you can see what I mean:

IF my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways;
THEN [I will] hear [them] from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Parents, when you deal with your children, you may not have known that you were using a logical construct that the Lord of Hosts has given you to use so you can raise your child properly. The Lord of Hosts is a logical, orderly being, and you will see as you continue to read this book how He maintains that logic in everything He touches.

This scripture is actually a complex compound statement, so let's take a look at that:

IF my people, which are called by my name,
[and] **IF** [they] shall humble themselves,
and **IF** [they] pray,
and **IF** [they] seek my face,
and **IF** [they] turn from their wicked ways;
THEN [I will] hear [them] from heaven,
and [I] will forgive their sin,
and [I] will heal their land.

If you see, there is always a qualifier in these statements. In this particular statement, the qualifier is :


my people, which are called by my name

So who exactly is the Lord of Hosts talking about here?

This is a conditional statement that applies ONLY to the Israelites, whom the Lord of Hosts took in as HIS people. This does NOT apply to the Moabites, the Hittites, the Amorites or anyone else. If a Hittite and a Moabite saw this and said that they are 'His people', do you really think that the Lord would honour that? In fact, the Hittites and the Moabites in this case have hijacked the scripture for themselves, and you can clearly see that theft.

Can you see how hijacking scripture, **which the Once Saved Always Saved crowd does all the time**, is **ERROR?**

Let's look at some of the scriptures that the once saved, always saved crowd use. They actually omit the 'IF' part, we will add it back in so you can see what we are talking about. Look closely and you will see the conditions that the Lord puts upon those scriptures:



Upon reading this passage, it looks pretty straightforward, doesn't it? If we examine this scripture a little closer, we can see that people's perceptions are NOT what the Lord is talking about here. If we take a closer look at the word **come**, we can see where there is an issue. So, let's take a look at the word **come** and see what this means in the context of this scripture:

to come

1. to come from one place to another, and used both of persons arriving and of those returning
2. to appear, make one's appearance, come before the public
3. to come into being, arise, come forth, show itself, find place or influence
4. be established, become known, to come (fall) into or unto
5. **to go, to follow one**

Uh Oh, Christian, can you now see the issue? In this context, **come** means that a person will **go to, or follow** someone. If you substitute this in the scripture, you would have the following:

All that the Father gives me shall **follow me**;
and him that **follows me** I will in no wise cast out.

Well, that changes the tenor of the passage, doesn't it?? With the definition of '**come**', we can see that it really means '**follow** or **to go follow**'. Jesus is saying here that **if you follow Him, He will NOT cast you out**. It involves the person to DO SOMETHING, Christian. **You have to willfully FOLLOW JESUS and IF you do this, you will NOT be cast out**.

Let's take the scripture, with the qualifier, and put it into the structure that was shown you:

All that the Father gives me shall follow me;

This is the qualifier - this establishes that the people that the Father gives Jesus will FOLLOW HIM. Here is the rest of the scripture:

and him that follows me I will in no wise cast out.

Here is the same scripture within our structure we built:

IF him that follows me
THEN I will in no wise cast out.

better stated:


IF you follow me [Jesus]
THEN I [Jesus] will in no wise cast [you] out.

Can you now see, Christian? There is ALWAYS a qualifier and a condition to every single one of the Lord Jesus Christ's promises.

ALWAYS.

In this case, the once saved, always saved crowd says that the Lord will not cast you out no matter what. Notice how they skip over the qualifier, **which is to have the person follow HIM FIRST!!** This is why we are saying that the once saved always saved doctrine is demonic.


Let's take a look at another one of their scriptures they use as proof and look at it carefully:



This is one of the most popular of the once saved, always saved proof texts. **On its face, this scripture is absolutely true.** However, as with many of the once saved, always saved scriptures, you have to catch the context. In this case, we are not even going to do that. When you look at the scripture, the first line says:

And I give unto **them** eternal life; and **they** shall never perish, and neither shall any man pluck **them** out of my hand.

OK, that sounds great, but **WHO** is **THEY**? **WHO** is the '**THEY/THEM**' that the Lord is referring to here? If we go back 1 verse, you will see who the '**THEY/THEM**' is.



Looks like the Lord is referring to His sheep. OK, so who are the '**SHEEP**'? Let's see what the Bible says:

Strongs NT:

metaphorically, πρόβατα, sheep, is used of **the followers of any master**: Matthew 26:31 and Mark 14:27 (from Zechariah 13:7); **of mankind, who as needing salvation obey the injunctions of him who provides it and leads them to it; so of the followers**

In this case, '**sheep**' is a metaphor used by Jesus to describe....

Wait for it...

Wait for it...

All Followers of Christ.

Did you notice the wording of the definition? Here it is again in case you missed it:

..'who as needing salvation **obey** the injunctions of him who provides it... '

Did you notice the word '**OBEY**'? The word of God is consistent, and it is consistently telling us that **those who get the salvation will need to OBEY the one giving salvation.**

In the last scripture, we saw that the Lord Jesus Christ made promises to **those that follow Him**. The context of this scripture starts back at **John 10:24**, as He is speaking to the Jews who want to know who He is. They are asking Jesus bluntly for Him to tell them who is REALLY is. Jesus references this by saying in **John 10:26** that they (the Jews) are NOT His sheep, or better stated, **NOT followers of Christ.**

Here is the full discourse:

John 10:24-31 - And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch. Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly. Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me. But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you. **My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:** And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. I and my Father are one. Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.

So what was Jesus really saying here?

Using a metaphor, Jesus was making the distinction between the Jews and those who follow Him, as the Jews were going to try and kill Jesus because He said that He was God.

The point here is that the promise that Jesus made **ONLY REFERRED TO THOSE WHO FOLLOWED HIM**. This passage, from **John 10:28-30**, **ONLY applies** if you were Jesus' sheep - which we defined in **John 10:26**. Only those who **FOLLOW JESUS GET THE PROMISE JESUS MADE**.

This disproves the claim that the once saved, always saved crowd says yet again. There is a **CONDITION** to the promises that the Lord Jesus Christ makes. In fact, if you look throughout the Bible, you will see that **EVERY SINGLE PROMISE made was CONDITIONAL**. The once saved, always saved crowd is overlooking that because it does not fit their narrative.

Let's add in the **IF .. THEN** statement so you can see what we are talking about.

IF My sheep hear my voice,
and **IF** I know them,
and **IF** they follow me:
THEN I give unto them [the sheep] eternal life;
and they [the sheep] shall never perish,
[and] neither shall any man pluck them [the sheep] out of
my hand.

As you can see, the Lord Jesus Christ's words are **CONSISTENT- You need to be a FOLLOWER of Jesus** before the promises made by Jesus will apply. Notice that the Lord has thrown us a compound conditional statement. If the sheep hear His voice, and IF He knows them (very important) and IF they follow Him, THEN He will give them eternal life, and they shall not perish, and no man will be able to pluck them from His hand.

Notice the conditions that apply, Christian. There are 4:

- You have to be a sheep (a disciple of Christ);
- You have to be able to hear His voice (which only true Disciples can hear);
- He has to know the sheep (which He will know only if the sheep OBEY His commandments);
- and the sheep must follow Him.

Only **when all 4 conditions apply**, then will the promise of eternal life apply.

Well, you say, the promises apply because we have confessed Christ to be our Lord and Saviour.

NO.

They do NOT apply.

Talk is cheap, Christian. Just because you 'confess', or SAY you belong to Jesus that does not mean you are a follower of the Lord Jesus Christ. **Jesus has to recognize you - and accept you - as His disciple.**

That is VERY important, Christian.

You are a follower - a Disciple of Christ - **when you OBEY Him**. As you obey, then Lord will then know you, as referenced in **John 10:27**. If you do not obey Him, you are NOT a follower of Christ, no matter how much you think you are, and Jesus Christ does not KNOW you.

Once saved, always saved is saying that you are to get the promises Christ made, no matter what, **without being a Disciple of Christ, and this is error.**



Just so you don't think we are just picking on the once saved, always saved crowd, here are a few more conditional statements in the Bible. Here is another example:

Numbers 21:2 - And Israel vowed a vow unto the LORD, and said, If thou wilt indeed deliver this people into my hand, then I will utterly destroy their cities.

Here is the same scripture within our structure we built:

IF thou wilt indeed deliver this people into my hand,
THEN I will utterly destroy their cities.

And another:

Jeremiah 23:22 - But if they had stood in my counsel, and had caused my people to hear my words, then they should have turned them from their evil way, and from the evil of their doings.

Here is the same scripture within our structure we built:

IF they had stood in my counsel,
and **IF** [they] had caused my people to hear my words,
THEN they should have turned them from their evil way,
and from the evil of their doings.

And another:

Genesis 18:26 - And the LORD said, If I find in Sodom fifty righteous within the city, then I will spare all the place for their sakes.

Here is the same scripture within our structure we built:

IF I find in Sodom fifty righteous within the city,
THEN I will spare all the place for their sakes.

And yet another:

Exodus 21:28 - If an ox gore a man or a woman, that they die: then the ox shall be surely stoned, and his flesh shall not be eaten; but the owner of the ox shall be quit.

Here is the same scripture within our structure we built:

IF an ox gore a man or a woman, that they die:
THEN the ox shall be surely stoned, and his flesh shall
not be eaten; but the owner of the ox shall be quit.

There are at over 300 of these statements in the Bible (Old and New Testament). We point this out because there are so many instances where the Lord of Hosts and even The Lord Jesus Christ say this and cut side covenants with regular people. Go through the Bible yourself and apply this principle in your own study time.



So, Christian, What have we learned?

Many people make the mistake of not truly understanding the Bible and how it is structured. **This is why you need the Holy Ghost to reveal the scriptures to you.** It is one thing to just read the Bible, but it is another thing to have it revealed. Only the Holy Ghost will reveal scripture to you, and this is why it is important to be a Disciple of Christ, as Jesus will send the Holy Ghost to His Disciples to teach them and train them.

The Bible is a very **complex, SUPERNATURAL book** that does not look like it is anything other than writings from people by people. Most atheists and those who do not know the Lord make that mistake. When you get the Bible revealed to you, you can then see the elegance and the wisdom that the Bible carries within it. This also **proves that the Bible is NOT FOR EVERYBODY; It is for the Disciples of Christ.**

Doing Bible Studies on your own **WITHOUT the Holy Ghost** will cause you to be discouraged and come up with the incorrect interpretation(s) of the Bible. Many 'pastors' know the letter of the Bible, **but do not know the Spirit of the Bible**, and this is one of the reasons why we have this debate about once saved, always saved. Once the Holy Ghost reveals to you that the promises are conditional, you can then clearly see that Once Saved, Always Saved is **ERROR**. This is exposing a lot of 'pastors' as **they do NOT have the Holy Ghost to lead and guide them**. They are relying on what they learned at the seminary or at a Bible College, and that is the letter of the word.

This is why you have some Hebrew Israelites referring to the Holy Ghost as a 'she'. This is why you have Baptist doctrine that the 'powers' of the Apostles do not apply today for Christians.

NO.

That is ALL ERROR.

With all of that being said, you can see that the Lord of Hosts and The Lord Jesus Christ produce MANY conditional statements in the Bible. When it comes to promised made, the Lord of Hosts and the Lord Jesus Christ always make **CONDITIONAL Promises**, and as you can see, the once saved, always saved crowd chooses to ignore the conditions and just glean onto the promises and claim them for themselves.

They are hijacking the scriptures for their own purposes.

We have shown that is error and that is how many people get hung up and deceived, as they think that they have the promise that the Lord gives but in reality they don't. This is a shock to those who just **KNEW** that they have the promise of eternal life, but find out too late that they never qualified for it.



As always, **take NOTHING that you have seen here in this book as the truth.** It is **YOUR responsibility to study and check out everything that you see and hear**, and you have an advocate in the Lord Jesus Christ who will help you if you would just ask Him.

Take this upon yourself, Christian, as **YOU** need to get **YOUR** Bible, **YOUR** concordance, **YOUR** dictionary, **YOUR** pens/pencils, **YOUR** notepad and then **YOU** need to seek out the Lord Jesus Christ and ask Him to help **YOU** so **YOU** can make it into His Kingdom, since it will be **YOU standing alone in front of Jesus** when **YOU** are being judged.

It is **YOUR** responsibility to make sure **YOU** are in the faith and that **YOU** have completed **YOUR** sanctification during the sanctification process and **YOU** have gotten **YOUR** forgiveness and **YOU** have repented of all of **YOUR** sins before **YOU** are judged by Jesus.

Scripture tells us that hell will enlarge itself to accommodate all of the people who will be sent there because of idols like the pope, as you can see in scripture here:

Isaiah 5:14 - Therefore hell hath enlarged herself, and opened her mouth without measure: and their glory, and their multitude, and their pomp, and he that rejoiceth, shall descend into it.

Take this as a warning, Christian, as the Lord Jesus Christ is NOT desperate for people, as **there were only 8 people** who got on the ark before the flood, and **only 2 people** from the Hebrews from Egypt made it into the Promised Land.

Be wise, and stay IN Jesus so you are not lost.



Don't you think it is time for you to get the understanding from the Bible that the Lord wants you to have?

As we always say on this site - **don't take our word for anything. Get with the Lord Jesus Christ and ask Him directly** if what you are seeing is true or not. Ask Him to show you this concept and more. Get used to talking with Jesus; build a relationship with Him and start to get to know Him for real.



Here is Our Challenge to you, Christian

We challenge you to go to Jesus directly **RIGHT NOW** and ask Him if what is shown here is true. Use this as a means to start a conversation with The Lord Jesus Christ and sit with Him and ask Him questions. Start with **(asking out loud):**

“Jesus, is what I just read true?”

He will answer you and NOW you will be on the true road to salvation, knowing for **SURE** if you are going to make it or not, as Jesus would have told you. Keep talking with Him. Get to know Him and He will start to reveal Himself to you. You need to find out for yourself and work out **YOUR** salvation for **YOU**, as the scriptures tell us to.



I want to stress that we are NOT a church, nor are we a ministry, and we do not want to be either. All we are saying is that **you**, Christian, should take what you read from these books you can freely download and bring these topics **up to the Lord Jesus Christ Himself and get your verification of what is being presented**. It will be up to **you** to talk directly to Jesus personally and get the understanding of the things you have read from Jesus directly.

Many of the topics that are brought up **should be taught in the Churches** so you will know the Lord Jesus Christ and be ready for when things get a little hot down here on earth. If your church is not teaching you how to be in Order or how to stay in Order, get out of there and go to the Lord Jesus Christ directly and get him to send you the Holy Ghost so you can be properly taught. **Being in Order is where the power is**, Christian, and you need the Power of the Lord Jesus Christ to defeat the devil and free your family and yourself.
